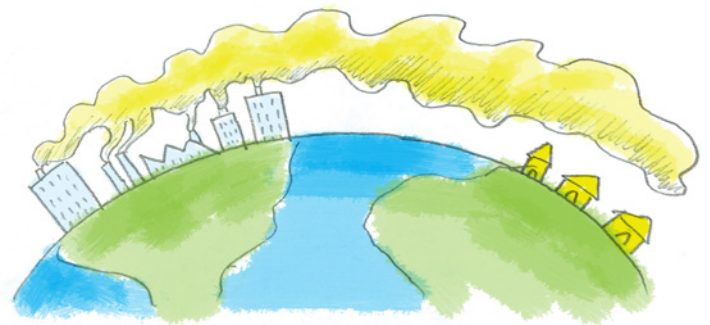

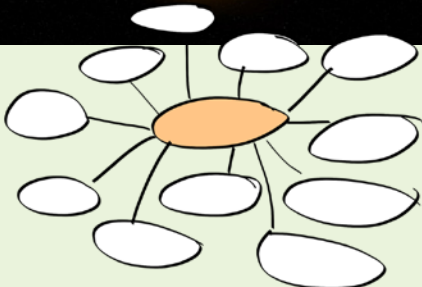
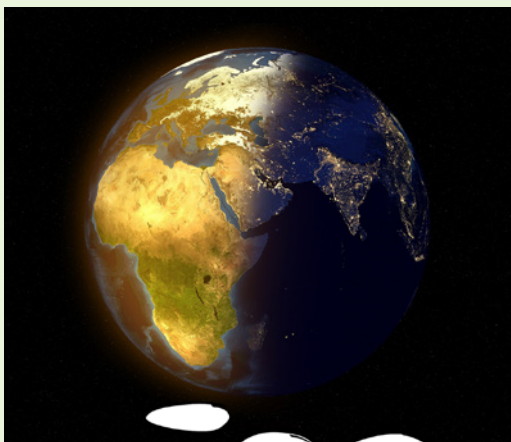

3 TASKS

- Discuss various ways we can impact climate change-globally and more locally through actions and initiatives (outlining micro and macro responses). Emphasise positive actions that individuals can make and the positive impact of reforestation of native species on a national and global level.
- Discuss the level of impact globally and whether countries are equally affected by climate change.

Discussion Questions:

- What can we do more locally to have a more global impact on preventing climate change and deforestation?
