

1 AIMS/OBJECTIVES

- ✓ Identify parts of the tree and various functions of each
- ✓ Explore the life cycle of a tree
- ✓ Explore the importance of trees in their local environment

Parts of a tree



2 INTRODUCTION

1. WALT (We Are Learning To) - Identify different types of trees.

Thinking Questions:

- What do we know about trees?
- What do we want to know about trees?

2. Picture of a tree - identify the various parts.
3. Elicit what the children know about each of the parts identified and any functions they perform.

WALT

3 TASKS

1. Explore the life cycle of a tree
2. Identify trees in their local environment and discuss the various functions of the trees, e.g., shelter and food for species in the local habitat

Thinking Questions:

- What are the functions of a tree?
- How important are trees to humans and the environment?

3. The Peruvian Pepper Tree is a native African tree that is used for food. Its juicy red berries produced can be dried and roasted and used as a pepper substitute. The fruit can also be made into an oil which is used in spiced baked goods, chewing gum and sweets.


The Oak Tree is a native Irish tree and is an important home to almost 20 species of bird and over 200 species of insects. Squirrels and badgers love their acorns and caterpillars flock to eat their leaves.

Thinking Questions:

- What are the comparisons between both? WILF Chart (What I am Looking For)- e.g, physical features, size, colors, fruits.
- How might the environment affect growth, physical features, functions of the trees, interdependency between native animals and habitats?
