Changed Life Story: Lavnis Tembo



Lavnis Tembo is a widow and mother of five living in the village of Tantwe in Zambia's Eastern Province. It's the second poorest region in Zambia with over two-thirds of the population suffering from serious hunger. It suffers from endemic livestock diseases, high levels of sickness and disease as well as low soil fertility. Half of the region's under-fives suffer from stunted growth.

But we were able to help Lavnis and the farmers' group in her village. Nine of the group's members have received female goats, and the remainder will receive female kids in the coming season. The goats now play a vital role in Lavnis' community. Their milk and cheese provides food and nourishment and they produce manure, which is used as a natural fertilizer for the land. (They can also be sold for profit or bred to produce more goats). Since these goats are inexpensive to keep and adapt well to local conditions such as those in Tantwe they have been helping to transform lives at a very low cost. We also gave training in how best to look after the goats and enabled the villagers in building goat houses to keep disease, pests and predators at bay.

Goats have made a real difference to people like Lavis and the others in her village helping them to work their way out of poverty and escape hunger.



For 30 years Self Help Africa has worked with rural communities to help them improve their farms and their livelihoods, tackling the poverty and hunger that blights the lives of over 222 million people. On a continent where up to 70-80% of people rely on small-scale agriculture for their survival, it is only by tackling the challenges faced by rural farming communities that real and continued economic progress can be made.
