

AGRICULTURE & NUTRITION

Over 70% of Africa's poorest people live on small farms. We help these farming families achieve their potential to grow much more and earn more from their land.



COOPERATIVES

We bring communities together working as a cooperative means farmers can access new markets and earn a better income from their produce.



GENDER

We're working to level the gender field in sub-Saharan Africa. When women receive the same support as men, yields increase 20–30%.



MICROFINANCE

We invest in people. Providing access to small loans through microfinance gives impoverished rural families the means to improve their farms, so they can grow, eat and sell more.



CLIMATE-SMART

Those least responsible for climate change are the most affected by global warming. We support vulnerable communities to adapt to changing climate, through climate-smart agricultural techniques.



ENTERPRISE

We nurture small businesses and encourage enterprise, enabling households to earn a vital alternative source of income.

Supporting **Families to Cope** with Climate Change

Successive years of drought has is making it harder for households in **Baringo County in Kenya's Rift Valley** to feed and provide for their families.

oaring temperatures and long dry spells have caused crops to fail. Watering holes have dried up, making the lives of marginalised herders even more precarious and uncertain.

For four years, Self Help Africa has been working with 10,000 of Baringo's most vulnerable households, helping small-scale farming families and semi-nomadic communities to withstand the worst effects of climate change.

Across an expansive programme of activities that to date has reached over 60,000 people, farming households have been provided with improved quality seed and drought tolerant seed varieties,

introduced to new crops that grow better in the hotter, drier conditions, and have been assisted with livestock programmes that have improved the breeding and resilience of goats, poultry and other farm animals.

The programme in Baringo has also restored and rehabilitated wells, established new watering points, and brought safe and clean drinking water to 20 local schools. Vegetable gardens that produce nourishing food for school meals have been established, while community groups have been formed to support small enterprise development, promote villagebased savings and loans schemes, and provide training in food

preparation and family nutrition.

Young mothers like Cecelia have been given the training and knowledge to grow new crops, earn more, and ensure that her children will no longer go to bed hungry.

Self Help Africa would like to express a word of gratitude tonight to our dear friend and supporter, Jaimie Alexander.

aimie, who is kindly emceeing tonight's Change-Maker's Ball has been a passionate advocate for our work, a champion for Self Help Africa who has spoken eloquently and from the heart about what we're doing to improve the lives of rural poor communities in Africa.

We were delighted when she agreed to take some time out, earlier this year, and travel with us to The Gambia, where she spent time with Self Help Africa's local team, and met with some of the people and communities with whom we're working.

On her visit, Jaimie spent a day with groups of women who are farming oysters in the mangrove swamps that fringe the coasts and the river estuaries of the West African country.

She talked to the women, and heard how they were not only earning a better living for themselves and their families, but they were also harvesting oysters in a way that's sustainable, and ensures that the mangrove roots aren't damaged by the harvesting process.

The 12,000 women who are farming oysters in this way have



also become local conservation champions, and are at the vanguard of local efforts to replant and restore mangroves in The Gambia and neighbouring Senegal – where a combination of human led development and changing climate have seen upwards of 20% of these swamps disappear since the 1990s.

Jaimie also visited fruit and vegetable nurseries that Self Help Africa has been supporting, and met women's groups and others whom the organisation has been working with, and supporting, in recent years.

The message of self-empowerment that sits at the heart of Self Help Africa's work struck a chord with her, and prompted her to agree to become a ambassador for our work when she returned home to the United States.

Since then she has been sharing stories about our work with her large social media following, has flown the flag for Self Help Africa at a Comicon Marvel Movies event in Texas, and is here tonight – not only emceeing this event, but also bringing along her own table of friends to support the cause.



Chuma Malambo

Chuma Malambo has become a role model for her family, since joining a local youth group in Monza District in southern Zambia less than three years ago.

Chuma's family was inspired to follow her footsteps into cassava production, after witnessing the success that Chuma has enjoyed since her group first began planting drought-tolerant cassava cuttings on a fenced-off plot of land in Hatila village.

Aged just 23, Chuma began earning an income selling cassava leaves, stem cuttings and tubers, which a local processing plant is buying from her youth group. Cassava growing requires minimal initial investment. Group members have reinvested profits from their sales to invest in different income generating activities. In Chuma's case, she has bought poultry to rear and breed, and is also benefitting from a grove of fruit trees that her group have planted. This provides them with both good quality food to eat, and an additional product that they can sell to earn an income.

"Since I started earning my own income from these enterprises, my family has been motivated to invest in both cassava production and in poultry," she says.

Chuma is among hundreds of young people in the Kafue Basin region of Zambia being supported by an Irish

Aid-backed project that is seeking to preserve the local environment and support the emergence of a vibrant local economy that helps farmers develop sustainable value chains. The project is also nurturing initiatives using biofortified crops that significantly improve the concentration of particular nutrients.






